# JACK EGAN MANNERS

Jack was the second of eight sons born to Kate and Barney Manners who lived just across the creek from the State School at Myall. Four Manners boys, (Ted, Jack, Bill and Syd) served in WW2. "Jack" born on 1/6/16 at Koondrook enrolled at Myall School on 5/5/22.

At Myall Hall in 2012 an ABC Open Day was held at which Julie Bagg nee Manners of

Koondrook gave a gripping account of her Uncle Jack's war history with much devotion to her search.

At the age of 24 Jack signed up in Kerang for war service abroad in the AIF. (Service No VX37281). Jack completed his initial training at Royal Park and after three months was posted to 2/29 Battallion where he was appointed Acting Lance Corporal and marched out. Before his embarkation to Singapore in 1941 he received a promotion to Acting Corporal and in February of that year married Dorothy Maffescioni. His next posting was Malaya where his rank as Corporal was confirmed

According to war records Jack was first found to be missing in action for 5 days in January 1942 and later found that he had been taken as a prisoner of war by the Japanese. Evidence of his movement from Muar in Malaysia to Changi prison on 22/4/42 was found in a diary written by Edwin Robert (Ted) Christie of Barham who passed on the diary to a mate at Changi after the arrival of Jack at Changi and before being shifted. Jack endured years of hardship as a POW in Thailand, arrived back at Changi to be moved to Japan.

In September 1944 Ted Christie and Jack were in the South China Sea on their way to Japan on the Rakuyo Maru. On 12<sup>th</sup> September the whole flotilla was attacked by US submarines unaware of the presence of POWs. George Lewcock of Barham was also on that Japanese freighter when it was sunk by an American submarine. Of the prisoners 152 survivors were rescued in the 5 days after the ship was sunk and 1,410 perished (which includes 7 prisoners who died after being picked up at sea). The survivors were suffering from severe malnutrition and tropical diseases. The incident has been described as one of the most sensational stories of the war.



#### HISTORICAL SNIPPET

#### **Murrabit Bush Nursing Hospital**

Medical assistance was available in Kerang from very early days, but it was a long trip with a sick person, over bad roads with slow transport. Most illnesses were treated at home, the nursing being done by the family, with help of kindly neighbours. Most babies were born at home.

Round the turn of the century, Mrs MURRAY, was a midwife and she brought most of the locals children into the world, followed by her daughter Phoebe (Reilly).

Murrabit Bush Nursing Centre was established on January 12<sup>th</sup> 1927 with membership of 60, and by the end of the year there were 98 members.

Bendigo Red Cross Society had generously donated 100 pound per year for 3 years to the new centre. The annual subscription was 1 pound 10 shillings, for a family and 15 shillings, for single people, and with a government subsidy the centre soon became an established part of the Murrabit community.

Sister TURNER, the first sister, boarded with Mr and Mrs PITMAN and the centre supplied a horse and jinker. In view of the time taken visiting patients, especially in wet weather, the Committee built a substantial cement cottage in Murrabit with a surgery for the sister's work. This made her more readily available and also enabled her to carry out Infant Welfare.

The Bush Nursing Cottage had a plaque on the wall saying "This stone was laid by Miss L JONES, Red Cross Society, Bendigo. Sept. 1930".

In a room, presumably the one used as a surgery, had a floor to ceiling mural of Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs

and their little cottage, there was a castle on a hill, squirrels, mushrooms, toadstools, trees and stumps (pictured right).

The Centre subsidised the cost of running a car and all the sisters after Sister TURNER had their own cars. Five schools in the area were visited regularly. Guarantors were Mrs E. A. ASHWIN, Messrs F. L. WALTERS, P BRYER and J.H. MORTON. Mr J.H. MORTON was also secretary, a position he held during the whole of the time that the Centre operated.



Each year the Centre ran a most successful carnival on the river bank near the Murray Bridge. Side shows, races and raffles were run and various other features were held from year to year to vary the program. One year two men dived from the top of the bridge into the Murray, much to the delight of the large crowd watching.

The day's pleasure was continued into the evening, a dance was held in the hall and the raffles were drawn. During the year several dances were held to help with the costs of running the Centre.

In 1940 "Glenarm" private hospital was taken over by a Kerang committee and run as a Bush Nursing Hospital. The Centre at Murrabit was closed and the cottage sold by Public auction in June 1940.

The mural remained on the wall for many years until it was painted over.

The cottage is in 'Church Street' and still lived in today.

This was a wonderful service to the district as bad roads, especially in winter, isolated the people from medical help. The sisters were all well respected and became part of the community.

The costs of hospitals and doctors were also a consideration in the days before government subsidies.

The Bush Nursing Society has a proud record of service and the Murrabit people were fortunate to have such a service if only for a few years.




