#### **Colour our Town Mural Project**

If you have been kicking around Murabit lately you are sure to have noticed the latest mural s completed on the Murrabit Market site.

It's taken a while to get these latest murals completed with interruptions caused by the stormwater installation project, landscaping projects on the market site, and the 2022 floods. They were however completed just in time for the February Murrabit Market and the end result was worth the wait!

Working with local artist, Paul Oswin, the latest murals - one of a large Murray Cod with a little Cod, and the other of a Murray Cray completed Stage 2 of the Murrabit - Colour Our Town project.

These new large pieces of public art are on the end of the main Broadcast Point at the market, facing Browning Avenue.





Paul specialises in specialises in painting Australian native fauna.

It has been exciting to work with Paul to prepare each location for his imagined works of art and to see them come to fruition.





The two latest murals add to the three others completed in 2021 - our 'Murrabit Market' mural, four cheeky kookaburras and 'Eric' the wedge-tailed eagle across the road.

We were also lucky enough as part of Stage 1 of the project to have Paul deliver a workshop at the Murrabit Hall. The workshop provided a great opportunity for locals to come together to learn some new arts skills.

The project has been funded by Gannawarra Shire Council, the Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal/ Gardiner Foundation, Murrabit Promotions Committee and Murrabit Advancement Association.

We hope to now be able to attract some additional funding so that Paul's creations can keep popping up in our little town to add some colour and a point of interest for our residents and visitors.

#### Death Notice: Peter Hoornweg

Peter Hoornweg grew up in Murrabit and in later years moved with his wife, Jeanette, to Drysdale near Geelong. Peter was an active member of the Murrabit community including the Golf Club, Cubs and Scouts. He was a Cub and Scout himself prior to becoming a Cub leader in the 1970s. He was also the District Commissioner for the Mount Hope District.

Peter would often return to Murrabit to catch up with old friends. Peter's daughters, Jenny and Lara, let us know that Peter passed away suddenly on 14 February.

#### Historical Snippet

#### The establishment of the Murrabit Township

Murrabit is a closer settlement town, established in 1924. Prior to 1924, the main settlements across the district were at Benjeroop, Gonn Crossing, and Myall.

Gonn Station, downstream of Barham on the New South Wales side of the Murray River, was a large pastoral holding (farm) first licensed to Robert Beauchamp in 1850. A punt operated across the Murray River between New South Wales and Victoria.

The Murrabit area was selected under the 1869 Land Act. A township site was surveyed in 1878 (at Gonn Crossing) A boarding house, post office, and blacksmith developed at Gonn Crossing on the Victorian side where the Gonn Crossing Punt operated.

The Murrabit Post Office opened in 1880, again at Gonn Crossing.

The Murrabit West Butter and Cheese Company Ltd opened in 1890 but operated for only two years.

A Murrabit Public Hall was built in 1912 (on the south west corner of Murrabit West and Dawe Road).

Schools operated at Murrabit West and Rabbit Point, along with Benjeroop, Myall and Capel's Crossing.

The Gonn Crossing settlement was dependent on the river trade and there was large developments, primarily of citrus, across the district. The community began to agitate for a rail link to join the line which had reached Kerang in 1884 and Swan Hill in 1889.

By the 1920s there was a settlement of returned servicemen and women from World War One and a recruitment of British settlers under the Empire Settlement Act. British settlers began arriving in Melbourne on 19 January 1924. To serve closer settlement, the Victorian Railways agreed to build a branch line from Kerang. This was under the Border Railway Scheme with a bridge to be built. A solid base for a bridge at Gonn Crossing could not be found and so the bridge was proposed for 4ms upstream from the Gonn Crossing Punt.


The building of the new bridge at Murrabit over the Murray commenced on 29 January 1924.

The settlement relocated with the surveying of a new township 'Murrabit' in 1923. The new Torrumbarry Weir was completed the same year and gravity irrigation reached the Murrabit district shortly after.

The township of Murrabit developed with the first 26 township blocks to the south of the current Murrabit Hall auctioned on 9 May 1924.

The hall built in 1912 was shifted into the new township in 1924, before being expanded to form a new public hall. The official opening of the railway from Kerang occurred on 20 December 1924.

Murrabit's fascinating history as a railway town servicing a prosperous agricultural region, will be celebrated at the 100th Anniversary of the Murrabit Township on the weekend of 5 and 6 October 2024.


