#### HISTORICAL SNIPPET

#### **Miss Margaret Keats MBE**

Margaret Keats, daughter of English pastoralist, Thorald

Goodwin Keats and his Scottish wife, Jessie Eliza (Cumming), was born on August 14, 1895 at 'Weilmoringle', a pastoral lease in the marginal country on the banks of the Culgoa River north east of Bourke, New South Wales.

From a very early age Margaret loved animals with horses being her first love. Her parents purchased "Gonn" Station on the New South Wales side of the Murray River in 1911. She was educated at Melbourne Girls Grammar. After completing school,

Margaret undertook a veterinary course at the Melbourne University to enable her to care for her own animals. She graduated in 1923 becoming the second woman in Victoria to become registered as a veterinary surgeon, and the first through Melbourne University. People began asking her for assistance with their sick animals.

In the early days Victoria did not allow a woman to be a Justice of the Peace but around 1926 Margaret was appointed a Commissioner of the Supreme Court for Taking Affidavits. She was appointed Inspector of Stock for the Gonn Crossing. No cattle could cross the Murray River without being inspected by her. Three times a week she was summoned to her post to inspect mobs of cattle and if passed, papers had to be signed for dispatch to both New South Wales and Victoria. As Commissioner of the Supreme Court she could attach her name without having to find a Justice of the Peace. She had a quarantine station on the Wakool River in New South Wales.... Numbers are looking very good in the juniors and in the seniors numbers are building with the prospect of a few more yet to get to preseason. It has also been great to see some new faces.





\$1 Million for Flood Recovery Music Events The state government has announced the \$1 Million Music Events Program to Boost Flood Recovery.

This initiative is designed to support independent live music venues to put on live music events. The events will be over and above what the venue already offers and should not be past, planned or recurring. It could be an additional night of music a week, or an expanded program with more artists involved, or a whole new special event. The aim is to boost live music venues while providing an enjoyable time for communities who are recovering.

Transport for NSW is carrying out essential maintenance work to Gonn Crossing Bridge at Murrabit. This work is to repair and replace key components of the lift span to ensure the bridge's

continued safe operation.

During the project there will be intermittent delays of up to 30 minutes accessing Gonn Crossing Bridge from Tuesday 7 February to Friday 24 March weekdays between 7am and 5pm, weather permitting.

We will aim to avoid delays during peak traffic times including school bus hours.

During the project, the lift span will be out of operation for six weeks, oversize marine vessels are advised to delay their journeys.

#### HISTORICAL SNIPPET

#### Miss Margaret Keats MBE (affectionately known as Miss **Keats)..Continued from Front Page Article**

For much of her career she travelled in a single seater A Model Ford (pictured below) enduring heat and dust and dreadful road conditions. In wet weather, chains were used.

While an animal needed her care, she would attend to it at all hours and at any time ably assisted for many years by Fred Skram (of an old Benjeroop family). There is a story of her crossing the Murray to attend



to a sick animal while the bridge was still being built. She inched her way across on a girder taking her veterinary bag

At one time she was Honorary Vet to Kerang, Swan Hill, Moulamein and Gunbower Turf Clubs, Kerang Trotting Club, Kerang Agricultural Society and Kerang Kennel Club. Her territory covered 11,000 square miles out beyond Balranald to the North, through the Mallee, and to beyond Calivil to the South. She practised from "Gonn" until the 1930s before moving into Kerang, where she practised as a veterinarian until she died in 1970.

She was awarded an MBE in 1959 for her outstanding devotion to the care and welfare of sick animals.



In 1968 she achieved her lifelong ambition to win the Kerang Cup with a horse she had bred "Flight On" The cup was presented to by the Prime her Minister of Australia, Sir John Gorton (pictured right)

"Flight On" won the Cup the following year and then again in 1970. Margaret died on April 5, 1970 at age 75 and is buried in the Kerang Cemetery.

The Picnic Area downstream of the Murrabit Bridge is dedicated to Miss Keats, a notable district resident who battled to obtain a university degree in days when it was extremely rare for a woman to do so. She then went on to have a successful career spanning 47 years as a veterinarian and throughout these years was known far and wide for her kindness and selfless assistance to anyone with an animal requiring her care.

The picnic area is an excellent location to view the bridge and the Murray River, and to enjoy a picnic.
