Council continues to work with local, state and commonwealth partners to support communities in the recovery from the October -December 2022 floods

Secondary impact assessments

Council-appointed contractors are conducting secondary impact assessments on assets such as roads, levees, community infrastructure and impacted residential properties. Some impacted residents will also receive a call from A1 Estimates regarding a secondary impact assessment (5IA) on homes. A1 Estimates is acting on behalf of Council to gather information regarding the impact of the October-December 2022 floods. A1 Estimates staff will also provide each resident with important health and safety information about impacts to their dwelling, including funding opportunities for residents without flood insurance coverage. Council-managed road network initial assessment

Initial assessments of damage to Council-managed roads have been completed where roads have been accessible. Where possible, Council continues to carry out repairs to significantly damaged roads, to ensure they are safe for vehicles to pass.

BlazeAid

BlazeAid volunteers are currently based in the Gannawarra to assist with clean-up efforts following the October-November 2022 floods, but need your help.
Local volunteers are needed to assist with on-ground efforts.
Whether it is for a few hours or a number of days, any assistance will help residents impacted by the floods.

BlazeAid is also seeking assistance from an administration whiz who can help out with data entry at their Alexandra Park, Kerang base. This role will only take a few hours a couple of days a week. If you can assist in any way, please call in to BlazeAid's base at Alexandra Park, Kerang or phone Council on (03) 5450 9333.

Skip bin service

Council's free skip bin collection service for rural residents whose primary place of residence was inundated or impacted by the floods is still available to landowners/tenants who are uninsured for such a clean-up. Register by phoning Council on (03) 5450 9333 or visiting Council's Customer Service Centres, located at Cohuna (open 10am-4pm weekdays) and Kerang (open-8.30am-5pm weekdays). Residents who are eligible for this service can only use the skip bins to dispose of flood waste. This includes carpets, white goods, furniture and plasterboard. Items that cannot be placed in the skip include tyres and machinery, food waste, asbestos, hazardous waste, materials that can be recycled and contaminated fodder.

Protect yourself from mosquitoes

Mosquitoes can carry and transmit diseases to humans. Murray Valley encephalitis (MVE) virus has recently been detected in mosquitoes in northern Victoria.

The best way to protect yourself is to avoid being bitten. This can be done by:

- Covering up wear long, loosefitting clothing.
- Using mosquito repellents containing Picaridin or DEET on all exposed skin.
- Limiting outdoor activity if lots of mosquitoes are about.

Sandbags

Efforts to remove sandbags from various locations throughout Koondrook will begin on Monday, 23 January.

As part of the removal efforts, Council staff will be available to remove sandbags from residential properties within the Koondrook township.

Residents wanting to access this service can do so by registering with Council by phoning (03) 5450 9333 and advising how many sandbags need to be removed.

Septic tank systems

If flood waters have affected your property, your septic tank system which contains sewerage from your toilet and greywater from your bathroom, kitchen and laundry may also be affected. This wastewater contains human disease-causing microorganisms such as bacteria, viruses and parasites. Most septic tanks should not be structurally damaged by flooding as they are below ground. However, flood water may enter your septic tank system through the toilet, other fixtures or the overflow relief gully grate.

Flooding of the septic system may wash out solids from the tank, causing blockages or system damage.

If you suspect your septic tank system has been damaged by the flood, contact a licensed plumber to have it assessed.


