Charles was 99 and lived locally until retiring to the north east of Victoria. Charles went to Rabbit Point Primary School and was one of the students who carried books and desks from the old school to the new school in Murrabit township, all the way back in 1926. In 1945 he started a poultry operation and went on to develop a citrus property. Charles was very involved in district organisations including at the Murrabit Packing Shed and Trading Store, Murrabit Hall, Tennis Club and Golf Club.

We were also saddened to hear of the passing of Ralph Steains. Ralph and Julie resided in Kerang. Both Charles and Ralph maintained a strong interest in the Murrabit community post retirement and their lives were celebrated at funeral services on 6 January.

24 hour accessible defib machines are mounted externally next to the kitchen door at the Murrabit Hall and at the door to the Murrabit Men's Shed. The Men's Shed defib machine cabinet also includes a set of pads suitable for children under 8 years. These life saving machines are available to anyone in an emergency.

Thanks to Ambulance Victoria who have recently added a Snake Bite kit to the accessible defib cabinets. EMERGENCY DEFIBRILLATOR This is a great addition which hopefully will never

be used - but great to have as a 'just in case'.


